

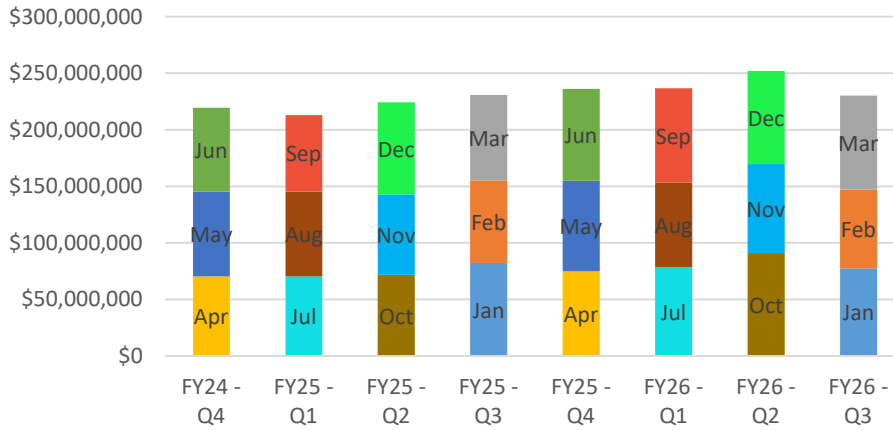

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Chart 1. Matched Taxable Gross Receipts Per Quarter

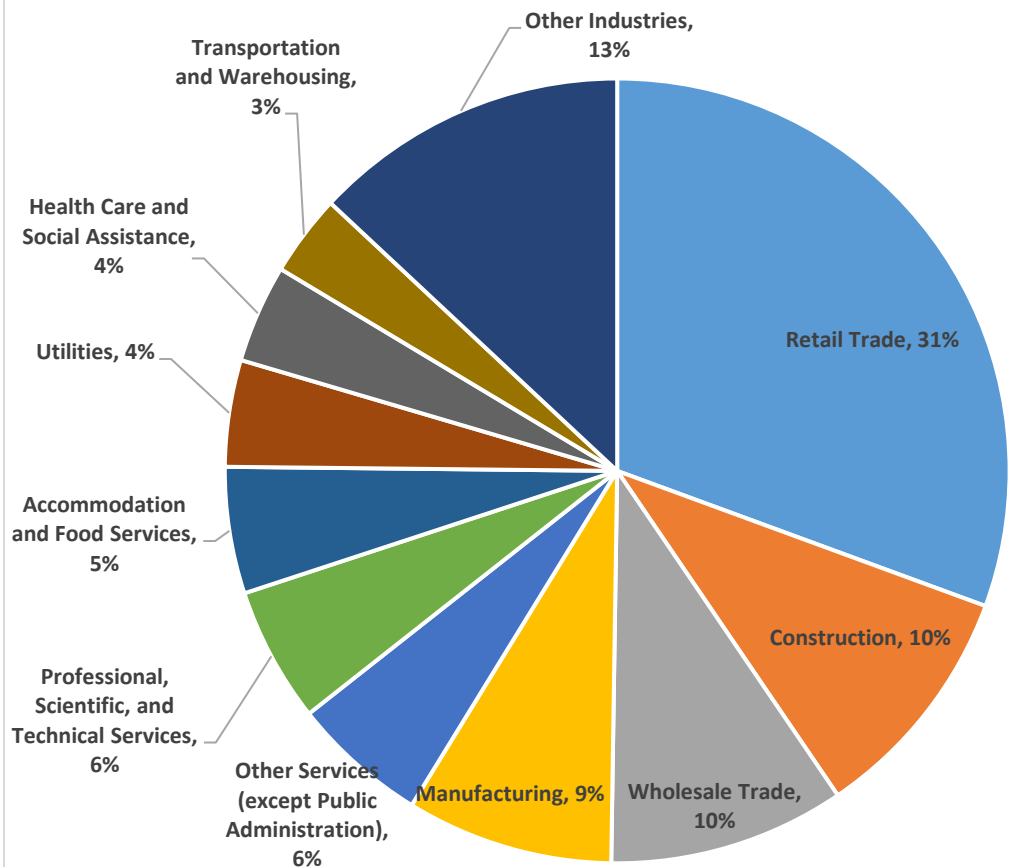

In the third quarter of FY26, 19 out of 33 counties reported positive year-over-year (YOY) economic growth compared to Q3 FY25, with a statewide 2.5% increase in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). Growth was observed across most industry sectors, led by construction and retail trade. In Q2 FY26, average employment in New Mexico slightly declined YOY, while average weekly wages and the number of establishments increased.

Grant County's MTGR decreased by \$21.9M, or 8.7%, from Q2 FY26 to Q3 FY26, as shown in Chart 1. The amount reported during Q3 FY26 (\$230.1M) was also \$196K lower than the eight-quarter average (\$230.3M). As shown in Chart 2, the largest industry as a percentage of MTGR was the retail trade industry, which accounted for 31% of the total MTGR during Q3 FY26. Last quarter, retail trade accounted for 30%, followed by construction at 17%.

**Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR)** provide the most accurate tax data for assessing underlying economic activity. The data collection process involves matching tax payments with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.

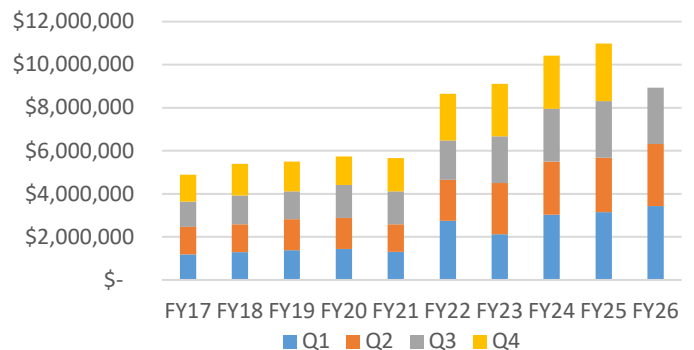

Table 1 shows that 16 industries reported a YOY increase in MTGR. The largest increase came from the manufacturing industry, which posted a YOY increase of \$5.3M. However, Grant County recorded an overall net decrease in MTGR of 0.3%, or \$751.2K, with the largest decline coming from the construction industry.

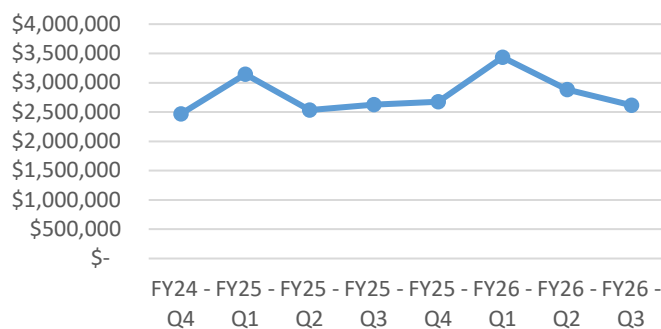
Quarterly gross receipts tax (GRT) collections during Q3 FY26 (\$2.6M), as shown in Chart 4, decreased by 9.3%, or \$266.9K, compared to Q2 FY26. While average employment in Q2 FY26 decreased by 1.3% YOY, average weekly wages increased by \$70, or 6.8%, YOY (Chart 5).

**Chart 3. Annual Total GRT Revenue Collections**



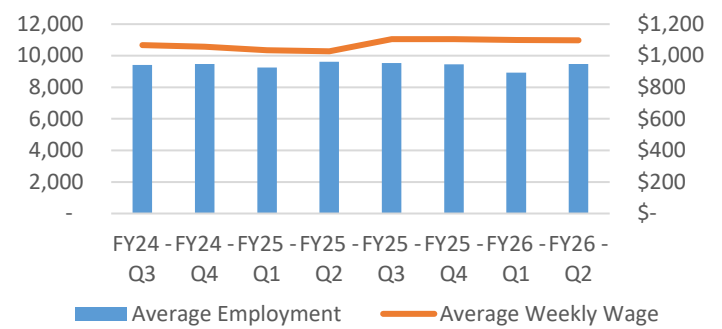

**Chart 5. Total Employment & Weekly Wage**

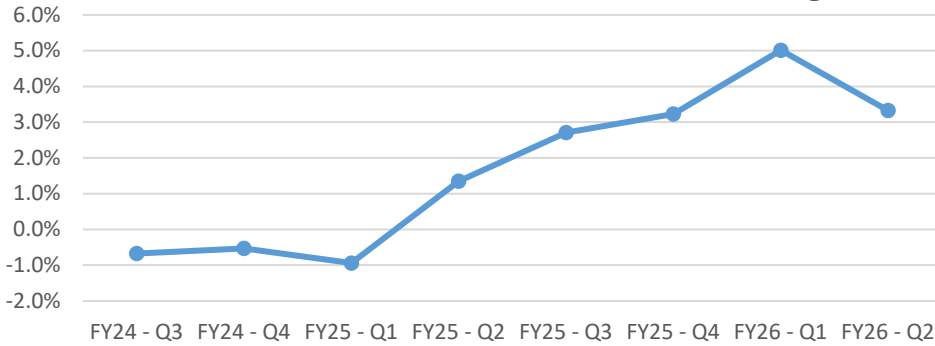

An **establishment**, as defined by the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and referenced in Chart 6, is an economic unit, such as a farm, factory, or store, located at a single physical address and engaged in one type of economic activity.

The **Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW)**, used in Charts 5-6 and Table 2, produces comprehensive data on the number of establishments, monthly employment, and quarterly wages for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and federal workers covered by the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. These data are aggregated to many different levels, starting at the 6-digit NAICS industry level, to higher industry levels (NAICS industry groups, sectors, and supersectors), and to higher geographic levels (MSA, state, and national).

Data are based on information reported by New Mexico employers, covering 97% of nonfarm wage and salary workers. Data are published every quarter. Considered the gold standard for its reliability of industry data, the QCEW data are the most complete universe of monthly employment and quarterly wage information by detailed industry.
