Allows SBA 7(a) lenders to accept applications for competitively priced lines of credit to support growth-oriented small businesses. Lender details are available in the [program guide](#). Small businesses can visit SBA's [Lender Match](#) page to be matched with participating SBA lenders.

[DreamSpring's Power Line of Credit](#)

Businesses that have fluctuating capital needs often use a line of credit, which allows them to borrow only what they need, repay all or part of the loan, and repeat as necessary without having to apply for a new loan every time additional funds are needed. The Power Line of Credit gives eligible businesses this type of flexible financing.

[New Markets Tax Credit Program](#)

Round 33 of funding applications is now open. Low-cost loans are available for rural for-profit and nonprofit entities that need financing for building, equipment, and working capital.

[New Mexico Match Fund](#)

Grant programs for eligible entities with a reliable source of funding to increase competitiveness for hundreds of federal grant programs that require a local match: matching grants, project implementation grants, and federal compliance offset grants. **Applications accepted on an ongoing basis.**

[Bernalillo County Employability Workshops](#)

Foundational Learning Alliance for Maintaining Employment (FLAME) offers workshops to enhance your career prospects. Every Monday from 3:30 - 6 p.m. until **October 28**.

[Rematriating Economies Apprenticeship](#)

A paid apprenticeship, designed by and for Indigenous women, that provides a nonconventional approach to explore and jumpstart a career in investment and financial management. Apprentices learn from industry experts, case studies, small group discussions, and practical exercises to develop the problem-solving and decision-making skills needed to craft an investment strategy. **Deadline: September 13.**

[New Mexico Arts and the Military Mini-Grants Program](#)

\$2,500 grants to assist organizations in creating and expanding arts programming for military-connected participants. Grants can also be used to build organizational capacity to create and expand opportunities for veterans and active-duty service members to engage with the arts. **Advanced review (required) deadline: September 23.**

[Landowner Cost Share Payment Programs for Climate Mitigation](#)

Provides competitive grant opportunities to entities and organizations for delivering technical and financial assistance to private forest landowners—including Tribes, underserved landowners, and smaller-acreage landowners. **Deadline: September 30.**

Regional Agricultural Promotion Program

Cost-share program reimburses nonprofit agricultural trade organizations, state regional trade groups, agricultural cooperatives, and state agencies that conduct approved market development activities to foster expanded exports and market diversification. **Deadline: October 4.**

Pathways to Removing Obstacles to Housing Grants

Empowers communities actively taking steps to remove barriers to affordable housing and seeking to increase housing production and lower costs over the long term. Available to local, county, multijurisdictional, and state governments. **Deadline: October 15.**

Recreation Economy for Rural Communities Program

Helps communities identify strategies to grow their outdoor recreation economy and revitalize their main streets. **Deadline: October 16.**

Preserve Route 66 Grant Fund

Provides financial support to public agencies, Tribal governments, or nonprofit organizations to preserve and interpret historic places along the Route 66 corridor. **Deadline: October 16.**

Opportunity Enterprise Programs

Provides low-cost financing to increase the supply of attainable housing and expand economic development. Loans are available for up to \$17.5 million for commercial development and up to \$15 million for workforce housing development or affordable housing infrastructure development. **Deadline: October 16.**
